RIDING ON... SHARED PATHS

SHARED PATHS

Are for the use of both pedestrians and bike riders. They are designated by images of a pedestrian and a bike on the pavement or on a street sign.

On a shared path:

- Pedestrians **always** have right of way.
- Slow down and ring your bell early to warn of your approach.
- Ride in a safe and courteous manner.
- Smile, wave or say 'thank you' as you pass.

NEW SHARED PATH MARKINGS

We are currently rolling out new blue on-the-ground line-markings to more clearly designate shared path areas and reinforce pedestrian priority.

1 SYDNEY PARK

Kick off your ride at one of the inner-west's best kept secrets. This sprawling grassland – the City of Sydney's largest park and also, at less than 20 years old, one its youngest – features a world-class all-skills playground, beautiful wetlands and a specially designed kids' bike track with working traffic lights to help budding bikers' build confidence. *Sydney Park Rd, St Peters*

2 TORTUGA STUDIOS

St Peters is a street art haven – all sorts of weird and wonderful animals and apparitions spring from its walls! – so keep your eyes peeled for cool murals on brickwork, down alleys and in developing spaces... or pop into this inspiring warehouse space for group art shows right opposite Sydney Park. *31 Princes Hwy, St Peters*

3 THE BUCKLAND HOTEL

Newly refurbished, their family-friendly bistro and sunny courtyard hosts great Thai food and cool drinks, making it a perfectly delicious pitstop on what can otherwise be a busy throughfare for junior bike riders. *Cnr Mitchell Rd & Buckland St, Alexandria*

4 ALEXANDRIA PARK

A lovely neighbourhood park with a floodlit sports oval, two tennis courts, a shady playground with climbing frames, slippery dip, swings and rockers and BBQ area. A favourite with two-wheel fans, it's also the site of regular bike polo games! *Buckland St, Alexandria*

5 PYD BUILDING

In the vibrant urban heartland of one Sydney's most exciting arts precincts is this nexus of design showrooms and cool exhibition spaces for local and international artists. Look for budding artist shows mid-term and during school holidays. *197 Young St, Waterloo*

6 FRATELLI FRESH

A fresh food market with a twist – beautiful fruit 'n' veg, artisan breads and cheeses and a world of imported dry goods upstairs next to Café Sopra – a lovely pit stop for coffee-loving parents and granita-loving grommets. Mid-week Fratelli hosts free weekly cooking classes, a hotbed for junior masterchefs of the future! *7 Danks St, Waterloo*

7 MOORE PARK GOLF

This famous driving range offers 60 bays over three protected levels and makes a perfect zen companion activity to cycling. *Cnr Anzac Pde & Cleveland St, Moore Park*

8 ENTERTAINMENT QUARTER MARKETS

Sustainably grown fruit, bounteous flowers and gourmet food with low food miles can be found here every Wednesday and Saturday (10am–3.30pm) for eating in or takeaway. There's also an animal farm for kids and plenty of open space to cycle

9 BUSBYS POND

Supplier of fresh water for the colony from 1830–1934 (and the scene of Sydney's last official pistol duel in 1851!), Busby Pond's history is second only to its birdlife – ducks, geese, cormorants, snipe, drongos and pelicans all call it home.

10 REDFERN PARK

Training headquarters for the South Sydney Rabbitohs and the site of many famous political rallies and cultural events, Redfern Park has a rich history and, thanks to a recent upgrade, a huge future for families. An enclosed, naturally shaded toddlers playground features both traditional play equipment and all sorts of cool, new art installations and water features and a cool cafe lurks nearby. *Redfern St, Redfern*

11 CARRIAGEWORKS

This arts and culture playground has always been passionate about providing a space for young creative minds to develop, collaborate, grow and flourish. There's regular art shows, theatre productions and the huge Sydney Childrens Festival every year in September. There are bike lanes on surrounding streets and free bike racks on-site too. *245 Wilson St, Eveleigh*

12 FERNSIDE SKATE PARK

Located at the south end of Waterloo Oval, this 920 sq. metre plaza-style skate facility is the first of its kind in Sydney to copy the urban streetscape layout popular with young skaters. It was designed in consultation with a local skateboarders and South Sydney Youth Service and attracts experienced and rookie skaters. *Cnr Elizabeth St & Allen St, Waterloo*
